Richard Jones WOPZD - conducted the presentation on the National Traffic System. It is a way to handle traffic in a structured means. We have NTS and ATEN nets available. When sending messages, the two most widely used formats are the AARL Radiogram and the ICS 213 that OEM uses. One good reason to know how to handle traffic is if you are somewhere where you have no phone or cell phone service and need to get a message out, you can access a radio net. When you check in using your call sign, name and location Net Control will ask if you have traffic. You can say yes and send yours. We will be having a drill on Saturday July 21st with OEM on ICS 213 traffic handling. Radio traffic started with Texas Baptist Men and the Salvation Army, the NTS started in Arizona in 2009 and has been on the air ever since.
